At Langney Primary Academy, R.E. (Religious Education) is taught following the new agreed syllabus for RE in East Sussex 2022-2027.

This syllabus adopts an enquiry approach to teaching R.E. covering Christianity, Hinduism, Islam and Judaism. It supports teachings in SMSC, British Values, Anti-Radicalisation whilst promoting critical thinking skills, growth mindset and personal development.

We want our children to learn about our world's religions through an enquiry based approach. This will give them knowledge of each religion and then require them to apply this knowledge to answer key questions rather than the knowledge being an end in itself.

Staff have access to a high quality R.E. scheme that provides teachers with all the knowledge and techniques of teaching the R.E. curriculum. Children are able to see and handle real artefacts that relate to their learning of R.E.
